In the future, resilience and adaptation of coastal communities to the pressures of flood and coastal erosion will be the key driver of the design of sustainable coastal management solutions. The coastline is under great pressure from human uses, intensified by the effects of a changing climate with rising sea levels and increased storminess. Within a challenging economic environment, the need to manage coastal activities in a sustainable way, whilst ensuring the health of coastal ecosystems, is becoming critical.

Supported and chaired by the Coastal Groups and LGA Coastal Special Interest Group; this workshop will propose case studies of high potential locations for sandscaping, discuss innovative management solutions, as well as barriers and constraints to development. The approach explores the innovative use of marine sand and gravel in large scale coastal protection schemes (where volumes are up to an order of magnitude greater than existing schemes) which utilise natural energy from the sea to distribute the beach, creating a new resilient coast. A new large beach forms a focus for placemaking – providing a catalyst for a locally-led coastal regeneration and development strategy.

Sandscaping offers an expanded, re-designed coast for habitat creation, recreational activity and enhanced tourism. Sandscaping can deliver the combined objectives of protection from flooding and coastal erosion as well as a variety of other environmental, economic and social benefits, whilst driving cost efficiencies.
